Please bring an Appetizer to share if possible.



Be Careful!!!!!!!

We have heard those words at every stage of our lives from mothers, fathers, friends and family. No matter how many times we have heard them they certainly merit repeating especially at this time in our lives.

One couple in our club made an agreement that neither one would step onto a ladder or chair to reach something without the other being there. Most of us have already gone through our house to remove things, like throwrugs, that we could trip over, and put hand rails in bathroom tubs. (By the way, if you haven't, please do.) Walking is the best exercise but consider a walking stick or hiking poles and walk with a friend. Look where you are going and be aware of your surroundings.

Beware of step ladders. Always hold on and have a buddy there.


Don't even think about stepping over a hedge, a box, a low hanging rope or a fence. You will likely fall.





I don't generally tout the personal 'non Club related' accomplishments of our members' offspring. So, if your child wins the soapbox derby; or, your grandchild nails the regional spelling bee; you probably won't see it in Solomon Sez. But, this one is just too rare an achievement to omit. I'm sure you will agree.



After more than 14 hours of swimming through strong winds, currents and heavy seas of the English Channel, Jimmy Loreto USNA '95 swam ashore to the beaches of France as the sun set on the evening of 22 July 2018. Greeted by friends and family, his English Channel crossing accomplishment was the final leg in the endurance goal that he set many years ago. The celebration of the successful English Channel swim also included the added bonus of Loreto becoming the 188th person to achieve the "Triple Crown" of open water swimming.

Over the last three years, he successfully completed the following three marathon swims to achieve this distinction:

Manhattan Island Marathon Swim (28.5 miles), completed on 1 October 2016 Catalina Island Channel Swim (20.2 miles), completed on 24-25 July 2017 English Channel Swim (20.9 miles), completed on 22 July 2018

Loreto was inspired to train in the sport of open water swimming after becoming involved with a group of Naval Academy alumni—and one of three official shared interest groups of the Alumni Association—known as "Run to Honor." Founded in 2007 after the combat losses of several members of the Class of 1995, Run to Honor sought to honor all heroes listed in Memorial Hall and support the families of Naval Academy fallen.
